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Pregnant Parenting Intervention (PPI) Linkage Specialist

Description

The Pregnant Parenting Intervention (PPI) program provides Intervention services aimed at reducing the impact, severity, and cost associated with a substance exposed pregnancy to the mother and child dyad and their Families by offering comprehensive Case Management services, Community-Based linkage and retention services, supports for family members/significant others and Evidenced-Informed education for mothers who report a past and/or present substance use disorder (SUD) diagnosis.

The Linkage Specialist will work directly with pregnant women, who reside in Texas, who report a past or present SUD, and her family members. The Linkage Specialist will work with Child Protective Services, treatment centers and other community-based organizations in Bexar County to deliver intervention outreach services. The Linkage Specialist is responsible for the engagement and linking of mothers needing to intervention services from substance use disorder. The Linkage Specialist will accomplish this by providing consistent support, guidance, and encouragement that impacts the mother in developing positive social relationships and achieving positive outcomes such as job retention, family reunification, and reduced recidivism.

Core Duties

- Demonstrated empathy, caring, and concern to bolster mother's self-esteem and confidence.
- Assist mothers in the development of intervention plans and goals.
- Provide concrete assistance to help mothers accomplish tasks such as obtaining childcare, transportation, employment, health care, and life skills training.
- Facilitate contacts with other organizations to promote learning of social and recreational skills, create community, and acquire a sense of belonging.
- Work independently in community settings with flexible working hours.
- Integrate strength and evidence-based practices into daily interactions with peers.
- Provide responsible documentation of services provided in client record.
- Attend weekly staffing and ongoing training as required by supervisor.

Qualifications

- A minimum of 2 years' demonstrated experience in working with parents and families.
- Experience working with Child Protective Services and culturally diverse populations.
- Working knowledge and understanding of Criminal Justice System a plus.
- Excellent oral and written skills required.
- Basic computer skills in Word and Outlook.
- Ability to attend 46 hours of training in peer coach training and to work 40 hours weekly.
